Letter from the Executive Director

As I reflect on 2025, I am filled with both gratitude and urgency.

At Family Promise of Gainesville, we had the privilege of walking alongside over 150 families this year, representing 475 individuals, many of them children. These are families who were facing housing instability, often quietly and without being seen. Family homelessness is not always visible, but it is very real in our community.

Through our housing programs, we use Fair Market Rent (FMR) as a guide to help families access safe and stable housing. In Gainesville, the average FMR is \$1,493 per month. When you include move-in costs like first month's rent, last month's rent, security deposits, and basic utilities, it costs over \$14,000 to stabilize just one family. These are barriers that most families simply cannot overcome on their own.

While the need continues to grow, so does our commitment. We are working every day to open the Promise Center, a space that will provide shelter, stability, and support for families in crisis. This project represents hope for our community, but we cannot do it alone.

None of this work would be possible without you. Your support and belief in our mission make it possible for families to find stability and for children to have a safe place to call home.

Because of you, families are finding hope again. Because of you, we are building a stronger future for our community.

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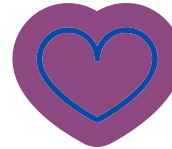

Our Programs

Permanent Supportive Housing

Our Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program is designed to serve households with a disabled head of household who need long-term stability and ongoing support. This program combines affordable housing with case management to help families maintain housing, improve their quality of life, and work toward greater independence. Over the past year, we served 12 families through PSH, supporting a total of 47 individuals. Through consistent support and stable housing, families are able to focus on their health, well-being, and long-term goals.



Stabilization and Essential Housing

Our Stabilization and Essential Housing programs provide critical support to help families stay housed by supplementing rent and utilities during times of financial strain. These programs are often the difference between stability and homelessness. This year, we served many families through these efforts, helping them remain safely in their homes while they worked toward long-term stability.



Rapid Rehousing

Our Rapid Rehousing (RRH) program helps families quickly move out of homelessness and into stable housing with short-term support. Assistance typically lasts 6 months to a year and includes help with rent and case management. This year, we served 26 households, supporting a total of 87 individuals as they worked toward stability.



Prevention

Our Prevention program helps families stay housed and avoid entering homelessness in the first place. We provide short-term financial assistance and support to stabilize households during times of crisis. This year, we served 27 households, supporting a total of 73 individuals and helping keep families safely in their homes.

Shelter

Our Shelter Program provides a safe place for families to land during a time of crisis. With a maximum stay of up to 6 months, it gives families the opportunity to catch their breath, save money, and work toward stability with support from our team. This year, we served over 30 individuals through our shelter program, offering not just a place to stay, but a path forward.

The Promise Center

The Promise Center represents a major step forward in how we support families experiencing homelessness in our community. After purchasing the building in 2024, we immediately began critical repairs to make the space safe and functional. This included replacing the roof at a cost of \$50,000, installing a new HVAC system for \$40,000, and completing extensive mold remediation totaling \$33,000. These were necessary investments to protect the building's long-term use and ensure it remains a healthy environment for families.

We are now working to raise the remaining funds needed to open the doors. Once complete, the Promise Center will provide up to 10 rooms for families with children who have nowhere else to go. This space will allow us to expand our impact, offer stability during crisis, and help families move forward into permanent housing.



When you donate to Family Promise, you are supporting families right here in your community who are facing homelessness or housing instability. These are parents doing everything they can to hold it together and children who deserve a safe place to sleep, focus on school, and just be kids. Many of the families we serve are one unexpected moment away from losing everything, and your support helps catch them before they fall further.

Your donation helps keep the lights on, the rent paid, and hope alive during some of the hardest moments a family will ever face. It gives a parent the chance to breathe, to regroup, and to move forward with dignity. It gives children stability, routine, and a sense of safety. Most importantly, it reminds families that they are not alone—that their community sees them, believes in them, and is willing to stand beside them as they rebuild.

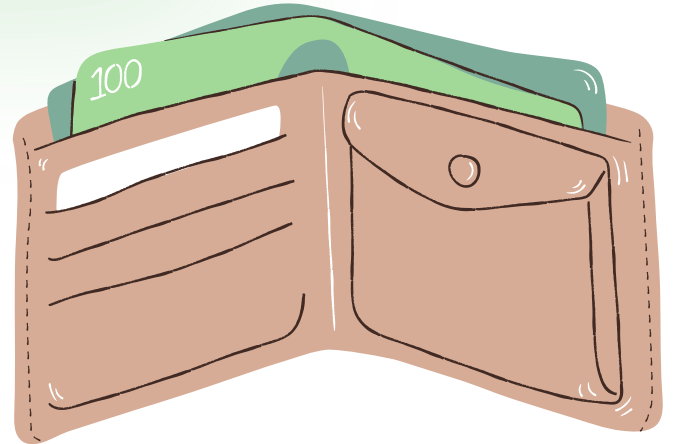
Total Revenue in 2025

Net Assets 2025

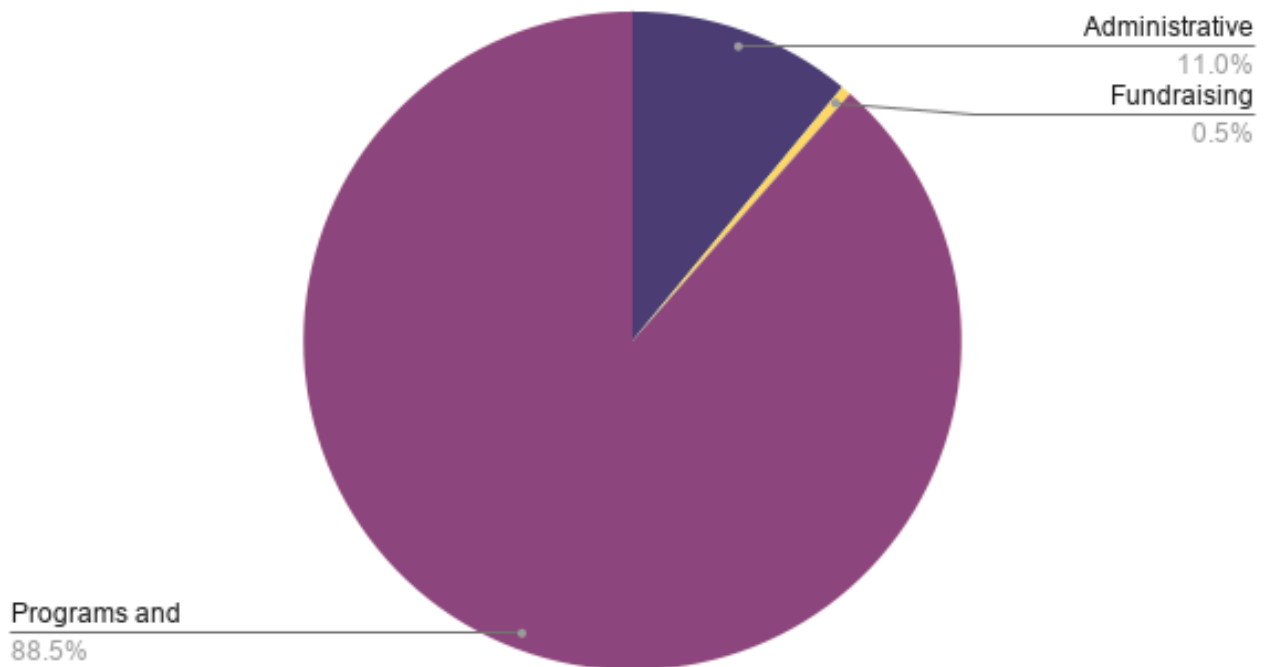
